- Stewardship Team update

Notable Aug Activity:

- ❖ For **the month of Aug** receipts were lower than expenses.
 - Total offering for the general/building fund for the month was \$31,865. This was higher than the budget by \$3,863.
 - Other income (building use, grants, interest, etc.) was \$8,319, which was higher than budgeted by \$2.
 - Expenses are favorable to budget this month, and favorable to prior year.
- ❖ For **August year to date**, receipts are lower than expenses, overall YTD we are down by \$3,594.
 - Overall, through August, receipts are higher than budgeted by \$37,228.
 - Expenses are favorable to budget for the year and favorable to last year.
- o Stewardship team has been assembled and will begin to formulate the stewardship plan for 2025
 - Cash balances available at the end of August were \$33,814 with an additional \$59,000 in investment accounts/reserve fund.

New Business

Finances needed to cover property repairs. Floor drains in kitchen are clogged with grease and have been cleaned after backup caused kitchen floor flooding. This has been done in the past, within the last year and when they were cleaned this time, they said it is a temporary band-aid. REcommendation: have drains jet cleaned, cost will be <\$2000. Mari motion to approve recommended jet cleaning of drains. Pam seconded, motion carries.

To keep up to date on fire code, a new firebox needs to be installed, this will cost approximately \$700 and the install can be made in house (either Nate or Men's group): Pam motions to replace firebox, mari seconded, motion carries.

Trees: there are several dead trees in the parking lot. The most precarious ones, that could fall or cause danger to person/property have been taken care of-the others are on the radar, but not a priority in spending right now. They are large trees and the haul away would be a significant limit for what we can do "in-house", Nate will work on quotes for removal in the spring.

Men's Group: They have asked for a process for getting supplies needed for regular repairs. Financial procedures don't allow for volunteers or mission groups to have credit cards, so the team can go to Nate for supplies or reimbursements as needed.
